Producer and director, Cindy Hurst graduated from Southern University, Baton Rouge, LA, majoring in psychology with an emphasis on African/Black Psychology. After graduating, Cindy developed the *Sankofa Project, LLC*, an agency that uses film to tackle relevant issues in African American communities. She completed film studies at Prague Film School (Czech Republic) and produced and directed foreign short film, “Familiar Spirit”(2011). *Cindy’s premiere film was Natural Woman*, which featured women from across America and abroad and prominent psychologists weighing in on the subject of going natural. The goal was to invoke honest dialogue on issues of *beauty, race, cultural influences, and self-acceptance as it relates to women of color born nationally and internationally*. She has also published the *Natural Mommy and Daughter Coloring Book*, a tool for parents and schools to help promote self-love and diversity among children.

Her most recent film, Remembering A Forgotten First: The Charlie Granger Story is the story of how a poor and determined boy from Southern Louisiana beats the odds of making it to the professional football league during the re-integration period of African-Americans into the league in the early 1960’s. It recounts his college and professional experiences as an African-American player and how the racial climate of the times impacted his career.
